

Greetings,

Thanks for inquiring about other ways to get involved. The attached documents merely provide a subset of options for groups or individuals who wish to travel independently to recent disaster areas and they can serve as connection points. Please note that to-date we have not vetted any relief options for Hurricane Irma except the Red Cross as access to many of the devastated areas in Florida have been limited. What is included is information on how to connect with agencies serving the greater Houston area, namely through the Houston Food Bank and World Vision. Until we learn more about volunteer opportunities in Florida, we suggest trying Red Cross.

By now, you all are aware that the need for “feet on the street” is great and so are the needs for:

- (1) for supplies to help with demolition and cleanup,
- (2) the need for shelter provisions,
- (3) food-water-clothing distribution, & medical help.
- (4) prayer and comfort care

These needs will be present for some time to come.

HFB wants you to know they're in it for the long haul.



An unprecedented number of people in the greater Houston area are affected by the flooding caused by Hurricane Harvey. The storm unleashed monumental destruction across southeast Texas. For individuals who already struggle to provide for their family's basic needs, the flooding is even more catastrophic.

How does the Houston Food Bank help people affected by Harvey?

The Houston Food Bank has a history of providing disaster relief, but we've never seen devastation on this scale. We will provide food and supplies in the short term and for many months to come to residents in southeast Texas who will struggle to rebuild their lives. The Food Bank will work closely with our network of partner agencies to ensure food is getting to those who need it most. We also find ways to connect offers of help with those who are providing help.

If you want to help those hit by Harvey as a volunteer:

- > **Please register first** to ensure you have a productive experience
- > Volunteer shifts apply, open daily (including Sunday and Labor Day)
 - Morning: Monday-Sunday, 8 a.m. to noon
 - Afternoon: Monday-Sunday, 1 to 4 p.m.
 - Evening: Monday-Friday, 6 to 9 p.m.

> To Donate Food and Supplies

Drop off curbside at 535 Portwall
Now through Saturday, September 9
8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Monday - Friday
8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Saturday/Sunday

> Most Needed Items

- > Canned ready-to-eat items with pull tops: vegetables, fruit
- > Protein in pouches or pull-top cans: tuna, beef stew, chili, canned chicken
- > Peanut butter
- > Snacks: granola bars, breakfast bars, etc.
- > Toiletries
- > Paper goods
- > Diapers
- > Cleaning supplies: mops, mop buckets, brooms, bleach wipes, bleach, garbage bags, bug spray

NOTE: All volunteers are responsible for their own transportation, lodging and meals when serving with the Houston Food Bank (HFB).

Special Message Regarding Hurricane Harvey Volunteer Opportunities

“Thank you for your interest in volunteering for Hurricane Harvey relief efforts. We are thrilled with the outpouring of support we’ve received from volunteers like yourself, and **are no longer taking** new applications to support **Harvey relief.**”

“However, we encourage you to explore other virtual and onsite volunteer opportunities with Red Cross such as **Hurricane Irma relief.**”

RED CROSS provides disaster relief training in most cases. All **RED CROSS** volunteers must, first, apply online. As far as we know, Volunteers may have to travel to the disaster relief sites at their own expense.

Volunteer assignments can last anywhere between 5-14 days depending on the assignment you choose.

Some assignments are physically more demanding than others. Take care in choosing what is appropriate for you. What are some of the volunteer assignments:

- Helping our shelters serve the community
- Load and unload trucks
- Serve food
- Provide comfort
- Welcome, onboard and engaging volunteers
- Help set up facilities

They also need volunteers who have supervisory experience and are available for 14 day assignments.

Requirements

Must be at least 16 years of age

(with parental consent)

Expected to work shifts from 6-12 hours a day

Must authorize background check after completing application

To serve as a **Red Cross** volunteer with respect to Hurricane IRMA relief, here's what you need to do:

- (1) Go to www.redcross.org
- (2) Click on Volunteer, then Volunteer Opportunity, then click on Disaster Volunteers.
- (3) In the box labeled "Make a Difference in Your Community", click on "Search Openings".
- (4) Look for the box labeled "Hurricane Irma Volunteers Needed...." and click on the **APPLY NOW** button.
- (5) The black and white web page banner will read: "Volunteer Application for Hurricane Irma Response". Click on the blue link that says, "please use this form". It is for volunteers who are not local to the affected areas.

A **Red Cross** representative will follow up with you.
